#### **Never Flush or Pour!**

Unused or expired medications should never be flushed or poured down the drain.

These potentially dangerous drugs can contribute to contamination of our water supply & drug overdose/death if not disposed of properly.

Residents can safely dispose of drugs for FREE at the locations listed to the right.

## **Drop-Off Guidelines**

- 1. Empty all pills into a clear, sealed 'ziplock' style bag that is sandwich size or smaller.
- 2. Keep all liquids, creams and powders in original containers.
- 3. Recycle empty pill bottles and paper boxes in your home recycling bin.
- 4. Discard all plastic caps in your home garbage.
- 5. Drop off liquids, creams, powders & bags of pills at designated locations.
