Drop-Off Guidelines

1. Empty all pills into a clear, sealed 'ziplock' style bag that is sandwich size or smaller.
2. Keep all liquids, creams and powders in original containers.
3. Recycle empty pill bottles and paper boxes in your home recycling bin.
4. Discard all plastic caps in your home garbage.
5. Drop off liquids, creams, powders and bags of pills at designated locations.
