
What is CCS?

Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) is a program that provides mental health and substance use services to individuals of any age. The purpose of CCS services is to help people identify and work towards meeting individual goals and improving their quality of life. CCS puts YOU in charge of your own recovery!

CCS Vision

This program focuses on recovery of persons with mental illness and/or substance use disorders through a comprehensive recovery model that is flexible, personally directed, and outcome based. It is our goal to focus on:

- Empowering each person to participate fully and take more control in their recovery
- Involving family and other natural supports in the recovery team
- Identifying a person's unique strengths and abilities
- Encouraging successful living in the community
- Respecting everyone's beliefs, values, and cultural customs.



Who Is Eligible?

Comprehensive Community Service (CCS) is available to both children and adults who:

1. Are a Calumet County resident
2. Are eligible for Medical Assistance, Badger Care, or another Medical program.
3. Have a mental health and/or substance use diagnosis.
4. Have a need for personal recovery, successful community integration and improved quality of life.
5. Are eligible as determined by the Wisconsin Functional Screen (we will help you with this!)
