

## Supplemental Information

### 1. Minimum Control Measures- Public Education and Outreach

Calumet County coordinated educational efforts in coordination with Northeast Wisconsin Stormwater Consortium (NEWSC), including hosting NEWSC staff at the Sundae on the Farm event at the county fairgrounds on June 23rd. The County presented the annual report at the April LCC Committee meeting and communicated it to the County Board the same month. The County continued to support Trout in the Classroom that the County conducted in coordination with the Chilton school system, in 2023 the event date was May 15th. County staff also directly participated in the NEWSC watershed clean up. Calumet County also placed several flyers and posters out for the general public. The LWCD also published an article promoting responsible disposal of household hazardous wastes in the yearly newsletter. Other activities that were performed in Calumet County by NEWSC, of which Calumet County is an active member, are listed in the NEWSC Annual Report.

### 2. Minimum Control Measures- Public Involvement and Participation

Calumet County provided opportunities for comment on permit activities throughout the year and emphasized a period of time for public comment with press releases to local papers and copies of the annual report on the LWCD webpage and in the LWCD office. The County presented the annual report at the April LCC Committee meeting and communicated it to the County Board the same month. Calumet County held 7 household hazardous waste and E-cycling drop off events through-out the spring and summer months with 650 residents participating. The County also hosted sites for the NEWSC watershed clean up event.

### 3. Minimum Control Measures- Illicit Discharge and Elimination

Illicit discharge field screening in 2024 was done along County Rd KK. Staff checked 82 outfalls during the year; one possible discharge was found and passed along to the municipality it was found in. The illicit discharge complaints were handled by the Planning and Zoning and include issues throughout the County.

### 4. Minimum Control Measures- Construction Site Pollutant Control

Calumet County issued 2 permits for construction sites larger than an acre. One was an agricultural site with existing stormwater facilities for the expansion.

### 5. Minimum Control Measures- Post-Construction Stormwater Management

Calumet County does not use any privately owned stormwater BMPs to meet pollutant reduction goals and Calumet County does not have jurisdiction over any stormwater BMPs outside of the County Road R.O.W. in the MS4 area. Calumet County LWCD is working on

inventorying private stormwater facilities along with helping the responsible parties perform inspections and plan for maintenance activities.

6. Minimum Control Measures- Pollution Prevention

Calumet County installed Iron Enhanced Sand Filter Ditch Checks in two county road swales to increase phosphorus removals. The number of practices did not increase as the existing swales are counted in the County's MS4 modeling. Calumet County used 11,593 gallons of salt brine and 468 tons of salt in April and used 136 tons of salt in May during 2024. Internal education in Calumet County is usually done as needed except for Highway Department which handles winter road management training yearly for employees.

7. Minimum Control Measures- Storm Sewer System Map

Updates planned to be made in 2024 will be delivered in 2025 as part of a stormwater program planning update.
